# Program News

- **Traditional Community Solar (TCS) & Batching Webinar Held Monday, October 24, 2022** Ability for Approved Vendors to submit Community Solar project applications will open on November 1, 2022, at 8:00 a.m. CPT. In support of the application opening, a webinar was held on October 24, 2022, to share information about project requirements, clarifications, use of scoring in the case of the TCS category capacity being exceeded, application submission, batching, payment, and additional support available from the Program Administrator. The Agency and Program Administrator appreciate all of the thoughtful questions stakeholders provided during the webinar. # • Reminders – EECs, CS Projects, and the TCS Category

*Use of Non-EEC Subcontractors/Nested Designees* – The Program Administrator clarified on October 21<sup>st</sup> through the TCS Clarifications #1 document that in order to receive points for the commitment to utilize EEC Designees within scoring *Section 3 – Equity Eligible Contractors,* the use of non-EEC certified subcontractors or nested Designees is prohibited. <u>This requirement is not extended to projects submitted to the EEC category.</u> <u>This is simply a requirement for the points that can be awarded under Section 3 of the scoring criteria for the TCS category.</u> Requirements for submission to the EEC category can be reviewed in the Program Guidebook.

*Community Solar Projects in EEC and Public Schools Categories* – With the opening of the Traditional Community Solar category on November 1, 2022, the ability to submit Community Solar projects into the EEC category and Public Schools category will become available as well. <u>Scoring criteria as outlined in the Final Scoring Guidelines are only applicable to the Traditional Community Solar category; CS projects submitted to the EEC or Public Schools categories do not need to and should not submit any materials as it relates to the scoring criteria. Finally, Community-Driven Community Solar (CDCS) applications have been available since September 1, 2022 and the 90-day application window for these projects ends on November 30, 2022.</u>

## • Batching Released in Portal on October 27, 2022

Batching functionality in the portal was released on October 27, 2022, at 8:00 a.m. CPT. The Program Administrator has published <u>technical documentation in support of the batching release</u> and other portal



support resources, which are all available at <u>https://illinoisabp.com/portal-help/</u>. Extended office hours were offered on October 27 and October 28, 2022 to support this release. Please see the Office Hours section below for future sessions offered.

• Equity Eligible Contractor Designee Application and Attestation Now Available

Approved Vendor Designees can now register as Equity Eligible Contractor Designees. This registration does not qualify projects from those Designees to be eligible for the Equity Eligible Contractor ("EEC") category. Such Designees need to work with an Approved Vendor that is EEC certified in order for their project to be eligible for the EEC category. EEC certified Designees may also work with an Approved Vendor that is not EEC certified, but all projects submitted by non-EEC certified Approved Vendors are ineligible for the EEC Category. The application process for Designees will use the same criteria as described in Section 2.B of the Program Guidebook. ## • Ongoing Program Portal Updates

The Program Administrator continues to update and optimize the new Program portal, provide new and updated supporting documents, as well as additional Office Hours for support, with updated sessions outlined in the Transition Updates section below. Recent updates include the following:

- New Feature Functionality Batching functionality for all project categories other than Traditional Community Solar became available in the portal beginning at 8:00 a.m. CPT on Thursday, October 27, 2022
- **New Feature Functionality** Traditional Community Solar Part I application submission will be available in the portal beginning at 8:00 a.m. CPT on Tuesday, November 1, 2022
- **Feature Improvement** AVs with multiple Vendor IDs now have ability to view any of their Vendor IDs' Disclosure Forms or Applications. As part of the November 1, 2022 re-opening of TCS applications, Community Solar AVs will be able to select any of their Vendor IDs in order to create a Part I application.
- **Issue Reports and Bug Fixes** The Program Administrator continues to investigate and address reported issues and bug fixes, including modification of an application field for REC value calculation, changing it from an editable status to a fixed field using an established calculation, which is expected to be resolved shortly.
- **Future Functionality** The Program is aiming for availability of Part II application in November 2022, with more information to follow.
- **Future Functionality** The Program is aiming for availability of the Disclosure Form API for Community Solar Disclosure Forms before the close of the calendar year.

## • Ongoing Operations Updates

The Program Administrator continues to work diligently to ensure that Program operations and processes are functioning efficiently and effectively to ensure ongoing Program success and stakeholder support. Recent and forthcoming operational updates include:

- Processing of project applications submitted prior to July 1, 2022, and transition to the new Program Administrator is nearly complete, and the Program Administrator will soon begin reviewing applications submitted in the new portal, in the order in which they were received.
- Part II applications are currently being processed in the order that they were received.
- The Program Administrator is making continued progress on Community Solar subscriber verification, currently working on curing start-date discrepancies with AVs.
- Data has been collected for the November REC invoicing, and AVs will soon receive generated invoices.
- Annual reports are being finalized to share with utilities by the end of October.

Upcoming and Recorded Equity Accountability System Webinars, and Additional Resources In accordance with Chapter 10 of the Final 2022 Long-Term Plan, the Agency and Program Administrator are leading introductory webinars to the Equity Accountability System (EAS), providing an overview of the EAS, discussion of key elements, future opportunities and requirements for Approved Vendors and Designees, and available support from the Program Administrator. #### • Expanded Consumer Protection Working Group Meeting on November 4, 2022

#### • Illinois Department of Labor (IDOL) Prevailing Wage Training Webinars

As noted in the <u>2022 Long-Term Renewable Resources Procurement Plan</u>, most Adjustable Block Program projects must comply with the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, which requires that employees engaged in construction activities related to a project be paid prevailing wage; minimum compensation levels are set by the Illinois Department of Labor. Information regarding prevailing wage can be found on the Program's <u>Prevailing Wage Hub</u>. IDOL is hosting informational webinars on prevailing wage requirements and will answer questions as time allows during scheduled webinars, which will be held via WebEx at the following upcoming dates and times.
