• DCEO CEJA Updates on Job Training Comment Process

On August 31, 2022, the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) <u>released a Request for</u> <u>Information</u> on the Energy Transition Community Grant Program, which was established by P.A. 102-0662, ("CEJA") and will be implemented by DCEO. • Public Schools Clarifications

The passage of the Climate and Equitable Jobs Act (P.A. 102-0662) introduced several new project categories within the Adjustable Block Program, including the Public Schools category. The IPA has drafted <u>the following</u> <u>clarifications</u> in response to stakeholder questions regarding the Public Schools category. These clarifications will be incorporated into the next version of the Program Guidebook.

• Traditional Community Solar – Final Project Selection Guidelines

On September 1, 2022, the IPA released <u>an initial proposal</u> and stakeholder feedback request on Traditional Community Solar (TCS) project selection and scoring criteria. Through this proposal, the IPA encouraged robust and comprehensive stakeholder feedback on the TCS selection process. Proposal responses were due on September 16, 2022, and the IPA received a total of <u>13 responses to the TCS Project Selection Proposal</u>. After reviewing the submitted feedback the IPA published the <u>final scoring criteria</u> and <u>rationale</u> documents. Please note that applications for TCS (and TCS projects within the EEC and Public Schools categories) will not be available until November 1, 2022.

• Upcoming and Recorded Equity Accountability System Webinars

On October 4, 2022, the Agency and the Program Administrator held a webinar formally introducing the Equity Accountability System (EAS), outlined in Chapter 10 of the <u>Final 2022 Long-Term Plan</u>. Topics covered in the webinar included an overview of the EAS, discussion of key elements, its applicability to the Adjustable Block Program including future opportunities and requirements for Approved Vendors and Designees, and available support from the Program Administrator. A recording of the webinar, a copy of the presentation slides and a viewer attestation form are available on the <u>Equity Accountability System page</u> of the Program website.

On November 15, 2022, the Program Administrator and IPA will hold a second webinar introducing the EAS and providing more information on annual compliance plan assessment, with more education and training to follow in early 2023. • Illinois Department of Labor (IDOL) Prevailing Wage Training Webinars

As noted in the <u>2022 Long-Term Renewable Resources Procurement Plan</u>, most Adjustable Block Program projects must comply with the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, which requires that employees engaged in construction activities related to a project be paid prevailing wage; minimum compensation levels are set by the Illinois Department of Labor. Information regarding prevailing wage can be found on the Program's <u>Prevailing Wage Hub</u>. IDOL is hosting informational webinars on prevailing wage requirements and will answer questions as time allows during scheduled webinars, which will be held via WebEx at the following upcoming dates and times.
